Latest News Taylor Report recommends clarity on parish councils power to fund church
buildings Published 2nd January 2018

The report of the Taylor Commission which reviewed the sustainability of English Churches and Cathedrals has recommended that the Government clarifies the legal powers of parish and town councils to fund church buildings, a matter SLCC in partnership with NALC, has been raising this year with Government officials.

The report states: "Section 8 of the Local Government Act 1894 confers a number of additional powers on a parish council. Among these is the power to execute works subject to the condition that they do not relate to property relating to the affairs of the church. The Local Government Act 1972, however, permits a local authority (whether at county, district or parish council level) to contribute towards the maintenance, repair or adaptation of churches and even possibly levy a parish rate on the basis that the expenditure would be in the interests of, and bring benefits to, some or all of the inhabitants of the area.

Evidence submitted to the Review suggested that there is considerable confusion as to whether the 1972 Act supersedes the Local Government Act 1894, and that the 1894 Act is still perceived as a barrier, preventing investment in church buildings by local authorities. Clarification on this point should be given, whether by repealing section 8 of the 1894 Act, or by the issue of guidance. This should clarify that local authorities can invest in church buildings in accordance with Section 137 of the Local Government Act 1972.

Additionally, repeal or the issue of guidance should clarify that certain parish councils are also able to fund church buildings using powers contained in the Localism Act 2011. The Act allows certain parish councils, as long as they meet certain criteria, to pass a resolution which allows them to have the benefit of the so-called "General Power of Competence". An eligible parish council is one in which at least two-thirds of the members have been elected (i.e. not co-opted), and in which the clerk has completed one of a specified range of training courses. Having passed such a resolution, the relevant parish council would have the power to fund repairs and improvements and changes to church property (albeit it would have to take such a decision in line with its proper internal processes)."

Crime Trends 1st - 30th June 2018 You will be pleased to hear that we have had no reports of thefts or burglaries in the Golden Valley this month, this is fantastic news. There have been plenty of other incidents keeping us busy however, from missing persons, road traffic collisions and neighbour disputes/domestic disputes to name but a few.

There was a suspicious incident in Wormbridge on Wednesday 27th June where the tail of a horse in a roadside field had half its tail cut off, and left draped over the field gate Incident ref 172-s-270618

If you have any information regarding any crime you can contact police on 101, in an emergency please dial 999. Please be aware that any information provided within this letter is to inform you of incidents of note and to request possible assistance. We do not want to worry you in anyway.

Any incidents stated are infrequent and spread about a wide area, and are over a whole month. Herefordshire is a safe place to live





Results and local arrests Residents of Eaton Bishop will remember seeing large amounts of rubbish dumped in four places around the village back in January – here is a photo of one of the sites

After extensive enquiries by Craig Sandman, our colleague at Herefordshire Council, the rubbish was traced to a household in **Kingstone**. A 34 year old male was questioned and although he admitted the rubbish came from his household, he claimed he had paid someone to take it to the tip. He refused to give further details and was fined £300 under s34 of the Environmental Protection Act for duty of care offences. This is because it was his responsibility to ensure that the person paid to dispose of the rubbish did so correctly.

A 59 year old male from **Dorstone** was issued with a £150 fixed penalty for depositing litter in Archenfield, having been seen throwing a bag of rubbish from his car into a field – this had been happening on a regular basis in the same place, which he admitted to.

A 23 year old male from **Kingstone** was also issued with a fixed penalty for littering in Kingstone; he was caught on CCTV throwing items from his car.

Two adult males and an adult female were arrested in **Peterchurch** on suspicion of assault; they are on police conditional bail.

Cold callers – 'scrap dealers' We have had several reports of persons calling at properties asking for scrap recently – we would be grateful if you could take down registration numbers and pass them to us if they call on you. You can contact us on our mobiles, on 101 or by e-mail, and we can pass details to our colleagues at Trading Standards. Scam news Another scam report sent to us by one of our readers –

Just when I thought it was safe to pick up the phone! Today's scammer called at 13:11 from 01254 785876 Pre-recorded message, female American accent stating that the call was from my internet provider (not specifically which one)

My router was being switched off within 24 hours as my IP address had been compromised. A number of options then given to select a resolution to the matter......

This one is going to alarm a number of experienced individuals let alone the more vulnerable out there.

Needless to say – hang up and block the number if possible.
